The Penn State Endowment Stewardship Report for 2008-09 was recently released by the University. This report contains the current financial health of the Chapter's scholarship endowment fund.

During 2008-09, the Chapter added \$1513.00 to the endowment. The book value of the endowment fund on June 30, 2009 was \$43,928.18.

Penn State anticipates that \$2,400 will be avail-

able for spending in 2009-10. This will allow us to continue to award \$2000.00 scholarships while increasing our overall funds.

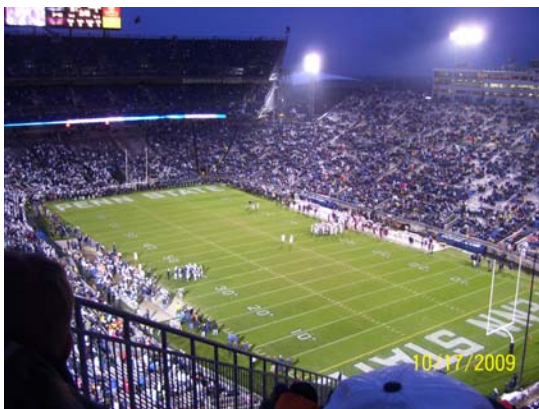


Homecoming Game - October 17, 2009

We had to wait three years for the next Penn State/Minnesota football game and this year as chance had it the game was scheduled for Homecoming Weekend at Penn State. In the days leading up to the game, State College received one of its heaviest snow falls ever in October. The Homecoming Snow Bowl of 2009 was an utterly delightful day. The sky was a nice battleship grey, the wind was calm and thousands of Penn State faithful fans marched down Curtain after trying to find buses to drop them off on campus. The stadium did not permit parking on the grass due to the 8" of snowfall that caused power outages and soggy fields. Tailgating was curtailed to Wal-Mart, Home Depot, Loews and any other scrap of concrete that would allow parking. Throngs of patrons were figuring out how to ride the bus system to campus.

As the game approached, the Blue Band marched up University onto Curtain dressed in their blue and white and filed into the stadium. By kickoff most of the student section, EA, was empty due to slow processing of the new ticket system at the Junior/Senior gates. The band was not allowed to march on the field, so the Alumni Blue Band in the north section and the Blue Band in the south section played back and forth Penn State favorites. The Minnesota alumni section was represented in section NL (Nosebleed

Level). We huddled to keep warm as we saw the Minnesota section below in the corner of the north end some 40 feet below. We



all had brought plastic bags or cushions to place on the bleachers to keep our butts dry. Actually, the seats were not as bad as originally thought. You did get a great view of all the action, though the players appear quite small.

The game started with a nice drive toward our end of the field and an early field goal. The sky was kind not to rain, but smoke from some of the tailgating grilling mixed with the damp air filled the north end of the stadium and created a temporary fog. As the

game progressed to the second quarter with the score only 6-0, some of the enterprising students discovered that they could make snow balls and they began a snow ball fight in the stands. This led to a few bright young kids discovering that they could throw their snow balls onto the field. In the direct line of fire was the Minnesota ball boy. He was smart enough to move toward the Penn State bench and work his way to the Minnesota alumni. A number of announcements tried to convey to the perpetrators that anyone throwing snow balls would be ejected. That slowed the pelting, but it continued into 3rd quarter as the attack escalated to our Lion and dancers during the Michael Jackson "Thriller" tribute. This was definitely bad form for our students. Some boos were being heard from the alumni in the stands. Finally, an announcement was made that aside from ejection, the perpetrators would be criminally arrested and their tickets for any remaining games confiscated. That stopped the snow balls but not the energy. The students in the top of Section EA built a 5 foot snow man in the empty seats. This was something for the crowd to cheer about.

As the game went on there was no real halftime program by the band. No one was allowed to march on the field for fear that the wet sod would be trampled ruining the playing surface. There was the introduction of the 46/47 team members, the story of the 1946/47 football team, their 1948 Cotton Bowl experience and how their unity and willingness to stand up against prejudice in those days was truly another wonderful reason to be PENN STATE PROUD.

The football game progressed with great defensive stands, an amazing catch by Derek Moyer for a touchdown, and a dive on our end of the field for a touchdown by Clark.. The rain started in the 3rd quarter and it felt a bit cold. The announcer said there were 107,900 attendances. Yeah right! Maybe 80,000 hearty souls showed up, but it was still great fun. Tickets were going for as little as \$10 at the beginning of the game. The Minnesota Alumni Association group cheered loud to help our Penn State team. The defense put on an excellent show stopping Minnesota at one point on a fourth and goal to preserve a shut out. The final score was Penn State 20, Gophers 0. At the end we all left in the dark and drizzle and eventually back to the airport of choice to return to Minnesota. 🌧️

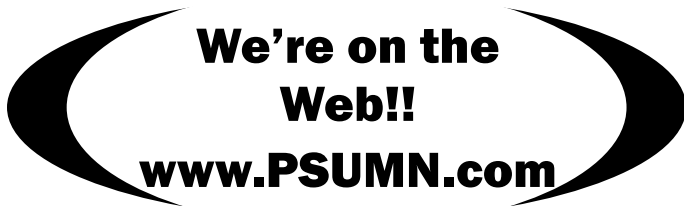
